GARDENS SPOTLIGHT

As you travel through the Gardens, watch for:

- Easter Lily: Known for its beautiful, trumpet-shaped blossoms, the Easter Lily symbolizes purity, hope, and life ~ the spiritual essence of Easter ~ and all the promises of spring. Sibley Horticultural Center
- Native Azaleas: These airy, open shrubs may reach heights of 15 feet. Some also have a wonderful sweet fragrance. Throughout the Gardens, including Callaway Brothers Azalea Bowl, Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Trail, Scenic Drive
- Fringe Trees: These are outstanding, small, deciduous ornamental trees. White Fringe Tree, also known as Grancy Graybeard or old man's beard, is native throughout the southeastern US. Sibley Horticultural Center, Scenic Drive
- Red Buckeye: The small tree or shrub is native to the southern and eastern parts of the United States. Scenic Drive
- Dogwood: This native understory tree features large white "petals" (actually a form of leaf known as bracts) surrounding tiny, yellowgreen flowers. Scenic Drive, all nature trails
- Cultivated Azaleas: These shrubs can grow 10 feet or taller, with varying colors and shapes. Callaway Brothers Azalea Bowl, Overlook Garden
