

Employee Purchasing Program (EPP) frequently asked questions

What is the Employee Purchasing Program?

The EPP was created in 2015 by Georgia House Bill 551. The Program was developed to provide eligible employees with centralized, online access to a wide range of consumer offerings they may purchase using the convenience of payroll deduction. The Department of Administrative Services (DOAS) facilitates employee purchases of consumer offerings through the EPP.

Who are eligible employees?

Eligible employees are at least 18 years of age, employed by an eligible state employer, with at least 12 months of continuous state service, works at least 30 hours weekly for an eligible state employer, paid semi-monthly or monthly and earns an annual salary of at least \$16,000.

Who are eligible state employers?

Eligible state employers are participating state entities that administer payroll in TeamWorks. TeamWorks is administered by the State Accounting Office. Some Legislative and Judicial Branches may choose not to participate in the EPP. For more information, see the complete listing of eligible state employers found at the end of this document.

What if my employer does not administer payroll in TeamWorks, can I still participate?

Only employers who administer payroll in TeamWorks are eligible to participate.

What types of offerings are available for purchase?

There is a wide range of DOAS-approved consumer offerings. The EPP vendor is not authorized to offer, and eligible state employees are prohibited from purchasing, consumer products excluded from the program by the DOAS or that are in conflict with state or federal law. Current prohibited items include Weapons, Alcohol or Drugs, Health and Welfare Benefits, and Health Services.

How do I “opt-in”?

When creating a profile and registering online you will have the option to opt-in.

What does it mean to “opt-in” to the Employee Purchasing Program?

Opting in also allows direct marketing to the employee by Purchasing Power, the approved vendor, for the EPP.

How do I pay for purchases made through the Employee Purchasing Program?

Eligible employees may only purchase consumer offerings through automated payroll deductions and must consent to payroll deductions prior to checkout. Deductions will be taken in compliance with current payroll system priority practices.

How is the deduction for purchases made in correlation with current payroll system priority practices?

Payroll deductions will only be made to the extent that the full amount of the deduction is available after higher priority deductions. Higher priority deductions are Health Benefits, Flexible Benefits, Child Support, etc.

How can I pay off my purchase early since I will have payroll deductions?

You have several options for paying off your purchase early. You may either log into your account online to make a lump sum payment or contact Purchasing Power at the dedicated contact center number for state employees which is 1-800-537-3134. The call center representatives are available to assist you Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. Eastern Standard Time.

Who do I call if there is a problem with my purchase?

Purchasing Power, the approved vendor for the EPP, is readily available to answer any questions you have regarding your purchase. Purchasing Power has a dedicated contact center number for state employees which is 1-800-537-3134. The call center representatives are available to assist you Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. Eastern Standard Time.

Who do I call if there is a problem with my payroll deduction?

Purchasing Power, the approved vendor for the EPP, is readily available to answer any questions you have regarding your payroll deductions. Purchasing Power has a dedicated contact center number for state employees which is 1-800-537-3134. The call center representatives are available to assist you Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. Eastern Standard Time.

Can my agency payroll department stop my payroll deduction for purchases?

No, your agency payroll department is unable to terminate your payroll deduction. If you have any questions or concerns regarding your deduction first contact Purchasing Power, who will work with TeamWorks, regarding your payroll deduction. Purchasing Power has a dedicated contact center number for state employees which is 1-800-537-3134. The call center representatives are available to assist you Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. Eastern Standard Time.

How do I return an item I have purchased and stop my payroll deduction?

Contact Purchasing Power with any inquiries regarding a return. They will work with you to return the item and stop your payroll deduction. Purchasing Power has a dedicated contact center number for state employees which is 1-800-537-3134. The call center representatives are available to assist you Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 10 p.m. Eastern Standard Time.

How long does it take my payroll deduction to end after returning an item?

If you return an item to Purchasing Power, your payroll deduction will stop on the next payroll cycle after the return has been processed. Purchasing Power will work with you regarding any refunds. Purchasing Power has a dedicated contact center number for state employees which is 1-800-537-3134. The call center representatives are available to assist you Monday thru Friday from 8 a.m. till 10 p.m. eastern standard time.

Can my Human Resources department assist with inquiries regarding the EPP?

While your Human Resources department offers assistance to many of your employee benefits, you should always contact Purchasing Power with any inquiries regarding the EPP products or offerings, payroll deductions, returns or concerns. State employees work directly with Purchasing Power and neither the state, or any state employer becomes a party to transactions between Purchasing Power and employees.
